 Law of Causation – Something that was caused must have been caused by
something else.
"What about God? Who created Him?"
 It is well attested in Christian doctrine that God never "Began to exist"

 "The universe is eternal. It did not have a beginning, so this premise is invalid."
 The Big Bang theory has become the predominant theory in cosmology, so
the burden of proof as to its cause has shifted.
 Naturalists claim that there had to be a beginning, yet they have
no answer as to its cause. We, however, do have an answer – our
creator God.

First, apologetics is important
 We are called to defend our faith with wisdom, knowledge, and depth of insight.
